<p>Chloe Monroe M.D. Anderson Fund</p>	<p>Contributions support annual contributions to the M.D. Anderson Cancer Research Center in Houston in the form of grants for research projects. TBW members visit MDA in Houston to learn of research projects in need of financial support. TBW, Foundation and MDA discuss which projects are recommended for support. In 1949, BPW members urged passage of State Legislation to appropriate funds for atomic energy-radiological facilities at the Hospital's permanent site in the Texas Medical Center in Houston, now M.D. Anderson Cancer Research Center. During her term as State President in 1974, Chloe Monroe named the M.D. Anderson Fund as a state civic participation project. Over the years, more than \$1,200,000 has been contributed to the Research Center.</p>
<p>Hermine Tobolowsky Scholarship Fund</p>	<p>Awarded to – a woman of academic achievement who wishes to enter the professions of law, public service, government, political science or women's history. Ms Tobolowsky devoted 26 years to lobbying and testifying before legislative committees for equal legal rights. The people of Texas voted for passage of Amendment 7, Equal Legal Rights Amendment, on November 7, 1972. On that day BPW members chanted "Oh Thank Heaven for Amendment Seven." In memory of Ms. Tobolowsky, BPW Dallas Inc. provided the initial funding to create a scholarship to support women pursuing public policy education.</p>
<p>Gilda Murray Scholarship Fund</p>	<p>Awarded to – a BPW/Texas or Texas Business Women member, 25 years or older, to obtain education or training to prepare for employment or to advance in a business or profession, who desires to continue and/or complete their educational requirements at their current job or in pursuit of a new career. The original funds were donated to the Texas BPW Foundation by the Garland BPW Club as they dissolved, in memory of Gilda Murray, a Past BPW/Texas State President.</p>
<p>Minnie L. Maffett Fellowship Fund</p>	<p>Awarded to – Provide financial assistance to promote medical education for women. Dr. Maffett was the first BPW/Texas President and a BPW/USA President. This scholarship was funded to assist a, female graduate of a recognized medical school/post graduate research in a medical field/female PhD from a Texas university who is doing research in a medical field/woman needing aid for the first year in establishing a family practice in a rural area with a population not exceeding 5,000/a fourth-year female medical student completing a M.D. or D.O. degree at an accredited school in the State of Texas.</p>
<p>MDA Endowed Scholarship Fund</p>	<p>Awarded to - a student at the University of Texas M.D. Anderson Cancer Center School of Health Professionals. Student chosen according to the University of Texas M.D. Anderson Cancer school criteria.</p>
<p>Unrestricted Fund</p>	<p>Provides funds for development and maintenance of website, to assist in capitalizing endowed funds, provide stipends to defray research expenses in using the manuscript collections in the TWU Library Women's Collection, development of new programs, provide scholarships for Women in New Roles and/or Women in Transition, assists with operations such as rental space, audits, websites, etc.</p>
